 - a. Student retention isn't something that can be presented in the self-study
 - 7. Working on more transparency around data. OAIR may be able to provide support in this process, may complete some of it
 - 8. Graduate student external employment policy discussion
 - a. Why services versus non-services?
 - b. What is the point of the conversation if everyone in a department is having to work, what would happen? There aren't more resources
 - c. Primary commitment is to education; what can the department do if a student's work is interfering with their ability to complete
 - d. Should Grad Council set a recommended stipend

- e. If the department set class times and a student's work interferes, what recourse does the department have?
- f. Can we come up with a list of best practices that should come from Grad Council
- 9. Dual credit policy for multiple Tulane degrees discussion
 - a. Students moving from master's degrees to PhDs, etc
 - b. Students are having to repeat courses if they get a master's degree and then later decide to do a PhD
 - c. We essentially disadvantage our own students
 - i. It also potentially decreases the attraction of our master's degrees
 - ii. Lots of students are using a master's degree to clarify their ultimate goals
 - d. This policy feels like something designed for undergraduates. 25% may not be appropriate should we go to 50% for students who are continuing on in the same field? Should there be differences for students going into a different field
