Prior to his work in program management and career services, Ryan was a K-12 Teacher in New Orleans where he was a 2x finalist for New Orleans Teacher of the Year.

Ryan's life path is not a traditional one. As a product of failing education systems, he dropped out of high school in Chicago, IL, and moved into the workforce, quickly becoming a successful operations professional. After years of proven success in operational process improvement and systems design, Ryan returned to school to obtain his GED (High School Diploma Equivalency). He immediately enrolled in college, working a full-time job and serving as a full-time student with a course overload. During his time in undergrad, he was awarded the prestigious Jack Kent Cooke Undergraduate Scholarship and Graduate full ride scholarship, was recognized with Christopher Mojekwu Intercultural Relations Award, and the President's Award. Ryan holds a B.A. in History and Secondary Education from Lake Forest College, and an M.A. in Educational Leadership from Teachers College at Columbia University.

Ryan is excited to usher in new and innovative approaches to career services for OGPS students. Over the course of the next semester, you can expect to see numerous changes, including revamping asynchronous support materials, launching new systems for communication and engagement, and providing leading-edge industry knowledge about the realities, challenges, and opportunities of the modern job search market for graduate and postgraduate students.
