# Support for Tulanians Impacted by the Russia-Ukraine Conflict

We recognize that many members of the Tulane community are impacted by the invasion of Ukraine and a number of offices are coordinating support for those individuals. The Office of International Students and Scholars is reaching out to international students impacted by the conflict to offer support and resources.

We are aware that we may not know of all the students, faculty, and staff impacted, so we want to remind everyone of the resources available to our community.

For students, Case Management and Victim Support Services can help arrange accommodations and general support. Their office is open from 8:30 am to 5 pm and are located in the LBC in suite G-02. They are available for walk-in appointments by Zoom and in person, and more information can be found on <u>their website</u>. They are closed with the rest of the university next Monday and Tuesday in observance of Mardi Gras.

For after-hours crisis support, The Line (504-264-6074) is available 24/7 to Tulane students.

Postdocs, faculty, and staff, can access resources through the Employee Assistance Program. More information about the EAP is on the <u>Tulane HR website</u>; it can connect employees to licensed therapists and one-on-one support.

## Black Women's Health Conference - Saturday, March 12

Registration is now open for Tulane University's 4th Biennial Black Women's Health Conference. The 2022 conference is co-hosted by, and will take place on the high school campus of, Dr. King Charter School in New Orleans' Historic Ninth Ward, Saturday, March 12, 2022. The conference theme, "Prevention, Protection, and Proactiveness: Understanding, Confronting, and Negotiating STD/STI Risks and Black Women's Health," examines issues of risk, protection, disparity, detection, treatment, costs, and consequences, in both conventional and emerging public health, social, political, legal, and historical contexts relevant to black women's health and wellness and sexually transmitted disease and infection.

The Keynote Address will be delivered by Joia A. Crear-Perry, MD. FACOG, President of the National Birth Equity Collaborate. The conference will also feature plenary sessions led by Dr. Jennifer Lapeyrolerie, specialist in obstetrics and gynecology, and Sesali Bowen, author of Bad Fat Black Girl: Notes from a Trap Feminist.
