Congratulations on completing a particularly arduous semester! Within OGPS, we are looking forward to a slower December, and one that will hopefully bring you an opportunity to rest, recharge, and reflect on the year that kept us on our toes.

In between semesters, however, you are still students and researchers, and your friends and family might have questions about the work you do, its impact in the world, and how it ties into current events. As our Three Minute Thesis competitors can attest, it is not always easy to condense your in-depth knowledge into a snappy elevator pitch that non-researchers will follow. Three Minute Thesis can provide an example of how you can convey your work, regardless of your field of study, as we saw in last week's sixth annual Tulane 3MT competition. We've included some tips below with examples from our competitors that can help you navigate those conversations this winter.

Before you start, make sure you understand and respect your audience as you find out their understanding of the background information. (Do they know what ethnographic interviews are? Do they know zeolites? Do they understand how dangerous hepatitis C is?) You should assume they want to learn about the topic, but that they have probably only seen the tip of the iceberg. From there, consider what the critical information is to have a conversation. (It is important that they know the justifications of restrictions on high-skilled immigrants if you're going to argue against those restrictions. They need to know what photosynthesis is to explain how you artificially recreate it.) Once the conversation gets going, start with a broad appeal that hooks your audience, then move deeper. Keep coming back to that hook for what the next steps are in the research process.


