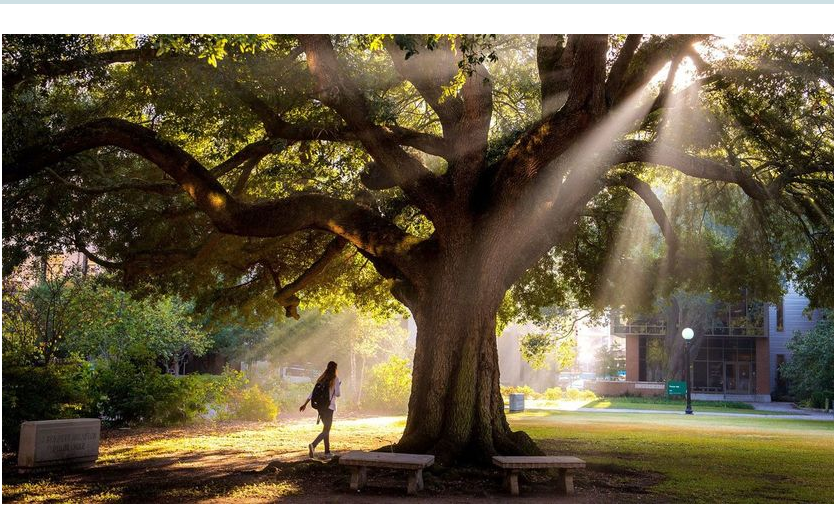

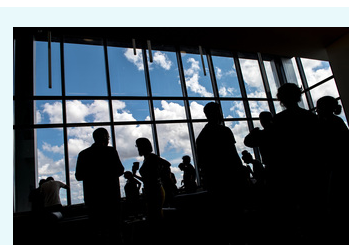
Postdoctoral Fellow Conference Support

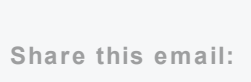
Informational Interviewing and Networking (Part 1) - Thurs, Oct 28, 9 AM
